

# Fight for Survival

2 players

Ages 10+

## Objective:

Invasive species (blue, white, and black.) take over the state (board = Oregon) by invading the native species territories and eliminating them. All of the same colored territories are conquered when one of the colored fields is occupied. The native species eliminate the invasive species by not letting them have any territory at all.

## Set up:

Put each colored piece on its own start.

## How to Play:

1. One player moves the native species and the other, the invasive. Each player rolls one of the two dice to see who goes first (highest number goes first). Each piece has its own colored territory at the start.
2. Territories are captured when one of the pieces lands on its opponent's territory. Then each player rolls a die. Player, who rolls higher wins the territory. The piece that lost is taken off the board.
3. It can only be regained by capturing a territory.
4. Peaceful Creek is a territory you can't take.
